Self - learning methodologies for students by making use of ICT was motivated. Continuous learning and evaluation methods for both UG and PG students were followed.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Dean examination will be the overall in-charge of conducting institutional and university examinations. Students learning ability was assessed by conducting periodic internal assessments in both theory and practical aspects. Students who were finding difficult to perform well in the assessments were concentrated to improve their performances.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Ethical committee scrutinizes the institutional research works to be carried out by the students. The students were sensitized for research work through CDEs. Faculties were encouraged to take up more research work.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Institutional library has almost all the standard textbooks required for UG and PG curriculum. Library has been upgraded with various new books and journal subscriptions. Helinet is available for both students and teaching faculties to assess the online published resources.

Institution has well equipped infrastructure for students both UGs and PGs in library with good studying environment.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Our institution has good number of required human resources for conducting academic activities and hospital management. The staffs are managed with good incentives for their efforts. Faculties are encouraged for enrolling in faculty empowerment programmes.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Teaching Faculties and supportive staffs are recruited according to the DCI recommendations. Institution has good ratio of students –teacher ratio for both UG and PG teaching programme.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The industry interactions/collaborations were carried out during PG research projects.

Good number of UG students and PG students got admitted in the current academic year through the government approved entrance exams and government sanctioned management quota. Students admitted to the institute were with good ranks in the entrance exams.
